



WELCOME TO ALL WHO ARE WORSHIPING WITH US TODAY

We are glad that you are here! We hope that you experience God in this place and that you find worship to be a meaningful experience. Below are some tips about how we worship at St. Peter that might be helpful.

- You can use this booklet (bulletin) to follow the worship service and participate if you desire. The parts marked P (pastor) and AM (assisting minister) will be read by worship leaders. Everything in bold print marked with a C (congregation) is for all to say together.
- If you have a prayer request you would like to include on the public prayer list, you may fill out the back of the yellow prayer sheet insert. If you have a prayer request that you would like to be read aloud during worship, please write it on a note card (in the box on the table near the glass doors of the worship space) and give it to Pastor Kristin before worship. Last names will not be included, and some information may be changed at the discretion of the church staff.
- Hearing assist devices are available. Our sanctuary is equipped with Telecoil through the sound system and microphones. If you're hearing aides already have the telecoil feature, just turn that on. If not, we have hearing assist devices available -please see an usher for assistance.
- Songs (hymns) can be found in the red ELW (*Evangelical Lutheran Worship*) books in the holders in the pew in front of you.
- Instructions for how we do communion are found in the "Meal" portion of this booklet.
- The service may be heard from speakers located in the nursery and Fireside Room.
- If you have any questions, please feel free to contact us using the information on the front cover of this bulletin booklet.

WELCOME CHILDREN



Thank you for bringing children to church! We are glad to welcome children in worship and we value their presence. Here are some ways we can help each other have the best worship experience possible and also help young children learn how to worship.

The Pray-Ground is intended to give our littlest ones some room to wiggle. It is the carpeted area in the front of the worship space because we recognize that kids are more engaged in worship when they can see what is going on. Small children, toddlers, and infants are welcome to use this space with supervision. The Pray-Ground is not intended to be a play area or activity zone. It is a quiet space; however, we understand that children make noise! Please help young children learn how to respect others in worship by using soft voices if talking is necessary.

Busy Bags are located on the coat rack just inside the glass doors of the worship space. Inside, children will find fun things to keep little hands busy during worship. Please return the bag and its contents to the basket on your way out of worship.

Nursery We understand that children sometimes need a place to be that is just for them. Feel free to use the nursery whenever your little ones might need it. The nursery is located next to the lobby. There is not a nursery attendant, so an adult must stay in the nursery to supervise and keep children safe.

Children's Message All young people are invited to the front of the church during this time.

Sunday School (K4-5th grade) meets on most Sunday mornings during the academic year from 9:15-10:15am.

WORD

FIRST LESSON

Acts 11:1-18

In defense of his earlier baptism of pagan believers, Peter demonstrates to the members of the Jerusalem church that God's intention to love Gentiles as well as Jews is revealed in Jesus' own testimony. In this way the mission to the Gentiles is officially authorized.

¹Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. ²So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, ³saying, "Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?" ⁴Then Peter began to

explain it to them, step by step, saying, ⁵“I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. ⁶As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. ⁷I also heard a voice saying to me, ‘Get up, Peter; kill and eat.’ ⁸But I replied, ‘By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.’ ⁹But a second time the voice answered from heaven, ‘What God has made clean, you must not call profane.’ ¹⁰This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. ¹¹At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. ¹²The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man’s house. ¹³He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, ‘Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; ¹⁴he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.’ ¹⁵And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. ¹⁶And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, ‘John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.’ ¹⁷If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?” ¹⁸When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, “Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life.” Word of God, word of life.

SECOND LESSON

Revelation 21:1-6

John’s vision shows us that in the resurrection the new age has dawned; God dwells with us already. Yet we wait for the time when the tears that cloud our vision will be wiped away. Then we will see the new heaven, new earth, and new Jerusalem.

¹I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. ²And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared

as a bride adorned for her husband. ³And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying,

“See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with them; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them; ⁴he will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away.”

⁵And the one who was seated on the throne said, “See, I am making all things new.” Also he said, “Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true.” ⁶Then he said to me, “It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will give water as a gift from the spring of the water of life.” Word of God, word of life.

BLESSING OF ALL THE PEOPLE

P: Dear friends: United with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, we are joined in God’s mission for the life of the world. We are called to that mission in our daily lives and in the ministries we share as the church of God.

P: It is our privilege to be the worshiping community of St. Peter Lutheran Church. We give thanks to God for the opportunities we have to encourage and support each other as we participate in the work of this congregation, whether it has been for a lifetime, a decade, a year or two, or a week. Today, we especially acknowledge those who are visiting or who are new to the St. Peter community in the past year.

P: Together, we are one in the body of Christ, who worship together and work for the good of the community and the ministries of this congregation.

P: With the whole church, let us confess our faith.

C: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. We are called to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all

the earth. People of God, do you intend to continue in the covenant of your baptism among God's people in this place?

C: I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

P: Let us pray. God of grace, we celebrate all whom you have drawn to yourself by the love of Jesus Christ and who are part of this community of faith. Keep us close together in your Spirit, in the breaking of bread and the prayers, and in service to others as we give you thanks in worship and with our lives. Bless our church, that your word may be proclaimed with clarity, that your meal may be served with joy and reverence, that this space may reflect your glory, and that all who are gathered may know your welcome; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

EASTER BANNERS – AN EXPLANATION

“Do not fear, I have risen” – Matthew 28:10 and “I will come back and take you with me so that you may be where I am.” - John 14: 3

Can we believe these promises? Can we trust them? Paul wrote, “If Christ has not been raised, then your faith has nothing to it: you are still guilty of your sins.” - I Corinthians 15: 17.

The left banner, hanging on the back wall of the sanctuary, shows what happened on the first Easter Sunday. Christ was raised! The joyous angel is there. The halo of Christ breaks through the banner border. Christ has broken the barrier of death.

The right banner shows another Sunday scene where the stone has been rolled away, the bedclothes are folded, and to the women who came to prepare his body with oils, the angel speaks, “Do not fear for he has risen.”

Joyful Easter colors were chosen for the women’s clothing instead of the mourning clothes they probably wore. We have the advantage of knowing the rest of the story, so we have prepared them for the celebration! Grief and disbelief show on their faces because of the missing body, the tear represents our fragile faith.

The pulpit is where holy and inspirational words “Do not fear, I have risen” are spoken. The altar cloth is filled with joyous, almost musical “alleluias.” Let our hearts be as full.

The gold background is the old chancel drapes salvaged during the renovation at St. Andrew Lutheran Church. God always represents something of great value. The victory over death is of highest value.

This ensemble is David Peterman’s interpretation of the Easter story. Thank you, David, for your willingness to share your insight and for your trust in the abilities of the many helping hands that contributed to the beauty of these hangings.
