LIGHTING THE ADVENT CANDLES

Into a hopeless world, Immanuel will be born, God with us, hope for all. And hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us. Today, we light the candle of hope, because, in God's presence, we find hope.

(Light the first blue candle)

Into a violent world, Immanuel will be born, God-with-us, Prince of Peace. And the Prince of Peace tells us when we become peacemakers, we will be called Children of God. Today we light the candle of peace, because in God's presence, we find peace.

(Light the second blue candle)

Into a sorrowful world, Immanuel will be born, God-with-us, Dayspring of Joy. This is good news of great joy for all people. Weeping may last for a night, but joy comes in the morning. Today we light the candle of joy, because in God's presence, we find joy.

(Light the pink candle)

Into an uncaring world, Immanuel will be born, God-with-us, Author of Love. And by God's tender mercy, God's tender love, dawn will break upon us and God will guide us into the way of peace. Today we light the candle of love because in God's presence, we find love.

(Light the last blue candle)

Into the world, Immanuel is born, God-with-us, born to bring good news to the poor, to proclaim release to the captives, to set free those who are oppressed, and to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor. Today we light the Christ candle, because unto us a son is born in the City of David, a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord.

READING


Isaiah 9:2-7




